It's time for volume #4 of the Lemonopolis Lesson Library! **Part of being a responsible business owner is caring about your community.** Read below for more information on the Sharing Goals lesson.



Now that your youth has set their spending and saving goals, they might consider giving a portion of their profit back to a local organization or charity. **Businesses have a responsibility to give something back to the community that supports them.** In this lesson, youth will be encouraged to think about donating a portion of their profit to a cause or organization that is important to them and their community.





Here are some discussion topics and questions you can ask your youth to reinforce the Sharing Goals lesson.

Discussion:

- Help your youth to identify a cause that is important to them.
- You can give them suggestions of charities that you support but also encourage them to do some research and find a cause that means something to them.
- Help them understand that their goal is to make enough profit from their lemonade business to meet or exceed their Profit Goal.

Questions:

- 1. Why do you think giving back to the community is important?
- 2. What are some things you care about? What organizations are helping meet those needs?
- 3. What charity would you like to share with?
- 4. What are other ways you can help in the community?
- 5. Now that you have set your financial goals, what is your Profit Goal?
- 6. Do you think that this goal is achievable?
